Kids in the Kitchen
Apple Cinnamon Graham Crisp

What You Need:

1 tablespoon peanut butter
 $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon cinnamon
4 graham crackers
 $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon lemon juice

What you Do:

Mix peanut butter and cinnamon in a bowl with a spoon. Spread half on top of two graham crackers. Use two more graham crackers to make two sandwiches. Spread the peanut butter-cinnamon mix on top of the sandwiches. Cut an apple in six slices and remove the seeds. Dip apples in lemon juice. Layer the apples on top of the spread and sprinkle with cinnamon
